

Nathan Coe Marsh

Technical Rider

To insure a smooth and worry-free event, please provide Nathan with the information for your contact at the event venue so he can directly coordinate with them.

Set-up Time: Nathan needs access to the performance space one hour prior to guest arrival for sound-check and setup.

Furniture: Please provide 4 (four) chairs for the show (three will be used on stage, one off-stage). If it is possible, it is recommended that one chair be a sturdy barstool 30 inches or taller.

Performing area/stage: The show requires a space at least 8' x 12' that can be clearly seen from anywhere in the room. Please do not seat guests behind the performing area. This entire area will be set-up with Nathan's props and in-use prior to guest arrival -- so the buffet line cannot go through it. If other performers are sharing the area, please inform Nathan in advance and provide him with their contact information so they can coordinate. The area should be entirely clear of band and DJ equipment.

Riser/Elevation: If you have more than 100 guests, please provide a riser of suitable height so that Nathan can be seen from the knees up. Video magnification is recommended for banquet groups over 400. Please insure that there are sturdy stairs either at the front or on the sides of the riser to insure easy access in and out of the audience (guests will be joining Nathan on stage). Please consult "Suggested Room Layout" for the best place for the stage.

Sound: Over 250 guests: a quality PA sound system with at least two channels of sound (I provide my own wireless microphone and mp3 player). If you have difficulty providing this, please contact Nathan and he will work with you to find a solution. (under 250 guests Nathan provides a PA system, which does require an electrical outlet)

Visual Obstacles: Please avoid tall centerpieces on the tables, these act like miniature sky-scrapers and make it very difficult for guests to enjoy the show. Please avoid situations where guests are seated behind columns or other visual obstacles.

Lighting: Lighting should be sufficient so that everyone can clearly see the show.

Introduction: Please have someone available to introduce Nathan, he will have a laminated card with his introduction on-site for your convenience.

If you want to get fancy:

Pipe and drape background, a follow-spot with operator will enhance the show, but are not necessary.
